ISAAC RESEARCH SYMPOSIUMS

Research Symposiums will be held August 3-4, over a two-day period following the Main Conference. Participants will explore theoretical, methodological and empirical issues of interest within the scientific community.

The Symposium will include a working seminar on Tele-AAC: AAC Meets Telerehabilitation: Envisioning Transformative Tele-AAC Research. This seminar is geared toward researchers, clinicians, educators and students who are interested in acquiring current information about telerehabilitation (telepractice) so that they might engage in and/or become knowledgeable consumers of Tele-AAC Research and identify current and future research needs and opportunities.

Module 1 of this three-part seminar is designed to brief non-telepractitioners on current definitions, telerehabilitation applications, potential barriers (privacy, reimbursement, licensure), and developing technologies from the perspective of researchers in the federally funded Research Engineering Research Center (RERC) on Telerehabilitation at the University of Pittsburgh.

In **Module 2**, researchers engaged in Tele-AAC clinical research will present current exemplars.

Module 3 will focus on the future -- engaging AAC researchers, telepractitioners, and most importantly, endusers, to envision the possibilities for both fundamental and transformational Tele-AAC research.
